ROLL CALL/CALL TO ORDER/ PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Council Member Abboud called the regular Village Council meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Village Council Chambers located at 18500 W. Thirteen Mile Road, Beverly Hills, MI 48025. Brown called the roll. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those in attendance.

Motion by Hrydziuszko, second by O’Gorman, to excuse President George, President Pro Tem Drummond and Kecskemeti from tonight’s meeting.

APPROVE PURCHASE OF PUBLIC SAFETY PATROL VEHICLES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2027

Rothe explained that the Public Safety Department replenishes its patrol vehicle fleet on a rotating basis, and that no vehicles were purchased in the prior fiscal year. Rothe stated that the Department is seeking approval ahead of the July 1 fiscal year start to avoid the anticipated annual price increase for model year 2027 vehicles. Public Safety Director Arnold presented a request to decommission two vehicles with a 2026 Chevrolet Tahoe and a 2026 Ford F-150 Police Responder pickup truck. Arnold stated that the purchases will be through the MIDeal Cooperative Purchasing Program. Administration and Council discussed the reassignment of the existing vehicles, maintenance tracking and fleet life-cycle management.

Public Comments:

Mike Garvey, Amherst, inquired about the vehicles lead times. Arnold estimated approximately six months from order to deployment on the street, contingent on stock availability and Canfield's upfitting schedule.

Motion by Mercer, second by Hrydziuszko, BE IT RESOLVED, the Beverly Hills Village Council approves the purchase and upfitting of Public Safety Patrol Vehicles for Fiscal Year 2027 as quoted. Funds are available in account #205-345- 970.00.

APPROVE PURCHASE OF SUTPHEN SL100 LADDER TRUCK

Rothe presented a proposal to replace the Public Safety Department's existing Pierce ladder truck with a new Sutphen SL100 aerial ladder truck through the Sourcewell Cooperative Purchasing contract at a cost of \$1,967,530.65. Rothe stated that payment would be due upon delivery, which is estimated in 23–26 months and anticipated to align with the FY2028 or FY2029 budget cycle. Arnold emphasized ongoing reliability concerns with the department's 13-year-old ladder truck, including repeated maintenance issues and increasing repair costs, noting that the apparatus was nearing the threshold for immediate replacement under the department's vehicle condition assessment. Arnold stated that the proposed Sutphen SL10 includes updated controls, enhanced aerial visibility technology, and consistency with the department's existing apparatus fleet. Administration and Council discussed the anticipated resale value of the current ladder truck, warranty coverage for the new apparatus, the Village's long-term capital planning and reserve funding strategy, and the complementary use of drone technology during fire operations.

Motion by Mercer, second by Hrydziuszko, BE IT RESOLVED, the Beverly Hills Village Council approves the purchase of a Sutphen SL100 Ladder Truck from Apollo Fire Apparatus utilizing Sourcewell Contract #082025-SUT as presented.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Anna, Dunblaine Avenue, is an interior designer and advocate for Dark Sky International, a nonprofit focused on light pollution education and she expressed interest in providing educational

information to the community on exterior lighting practices and their impacts on human health, wildlife, and the environment.

MANAGER’S REPORT

Rothe went over the Manager’s report as provided in the regular Village Council meeting packet. Rothe and Council discussed the June 2nd Council meeting, Beverly Park playground and BS&A cloud conversion.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Mercer encouraged residents to attend the Memorial Day Parade and Carnival and to reflect on the day's true purpose-honoring those who gave their lives in service to the country.

Hrydziuszko commended the progress of the sidewalk replacement project and reiterated the venue change for the Parks & Recreation Board meeting to the Beverly Park Pavilion. She also expressed support for exploring dark sky initiatives and referenced lighting practices observed in Dublin as a potential model for the Village. Hrydziuszko encouraged residents to reduce unnecessary exterior lighting and voiced support for considering future dark sky ordinance provisions.

Abboud reported that the upcoming SEMCOG Legislative Roundtable is scheduled for Friday, June 12th and it will focus on federal and state policy proposals, property tax reform, and local decision-making authority. He also reported on his participation in the Michigan Municipal League Elected Officials Academy (EOA) advisory board and noted his completion of all four levels of the EOA program and being one of approximately 20 elected officials statewide to have achieved the Ambassador designation since the program's inception in 1997. Abboud stated that there is a Cable Board meeting tomorrow and gave an undated on Next’s planned relocation to 400 Lincoln Street in May 2027. Abboud also announced the NEXT Golf Outing scheduled for Monday, September 14, 2026, and reported on a SMART transportation presentation at the Senior Advisory Council on May 18th.

Summary:

The Michigan Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices set the standards for pavement markings and signage within the state. Agencies and jurisdictions, including The Village of Beverly Hills, are required to follow the manual when maintaining the roadways. The Road Commission for Oakland County has bid out the pavement marking process for 2026 and will allow the Village to utilize the bid pricing to paint the roads in the Village. Because of their size and the ability to utilize their purchasing power, the cities and villages in Oakland County tag on to this bid contract for their street markings. The contractor, PK Contracting Inc., does the painting throughout the entire County at one time.

Center/Edge Line Painting – The Village is responsible for the maintenance of 13 Mile, portions of 14 Mile, Evergreen and Beverly per PA 51, 153,000+ feet of pavement lines. The State funds maintenance of these major roads through PA 51. The estimated cost for this work through the RCOC contract is \$34,560. We recommend that \$35,500 be used as the cost because the lineal foot measurement is an estimate that was confirmed by aerial measurements. RCOC will see that the work is completed and invoice the Village.

Turning Arrows, Only, Stop Bars, Crosswalks and School legends are also a part of the RCOC contract. Every signalized intersection, near parks, and around schools require these types of markings. I recommend that the marking be done every other year. Line painting completed one year and the additional markings the following year. We are not recommending these markings at this time as they were completed last year.

Recommendation – It is staff's recommendation to Village Council to utilize the RCOC contract for centerline and edge markings to be completed in the Village of Beverly Hills in 2026. The cost of this work is estimated at \$35,500.00.

Financial Impact:

Sufficient funds are available in the Fiscal Year 2027 budget to complete this project.

Recommendation:

Be It Resolved that the Beverly Hills Village Council approves the proposed bid pricing submitted by the Road Commission for Oakland County in the amount of \$35,500.00 for centerline and edge marking in the Village of Beverly Hills for calendar year 2026 as outlined on the attached. Funds are available in account 202-474-934.30 and 203-474-934.30.

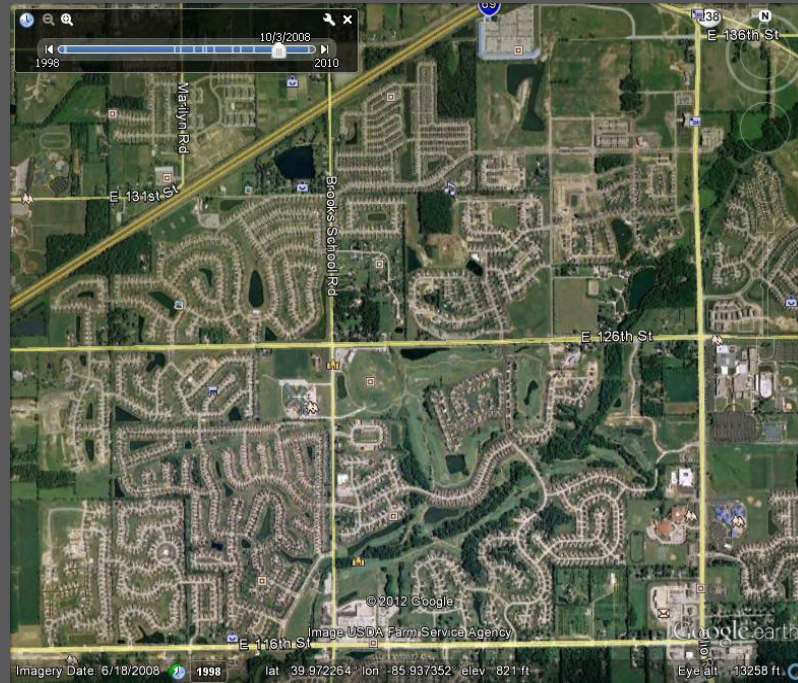

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2026, by and between the Village of Beverly Hills, Oakland County, Michigan (hereafter referred to as “the Village”), and the City of Southfield, Oakland County, Michigan (hereafter referred to as “the City”)The Village and the City are referred to individually as a “Party” and collectively as the “Parties.”

WHEREAS, the City has secured federal Surface Transportation Program (“STP”) funding for the resurfacing of 13 Mile Road from Southfield Road to Greenfield Road; and

WHEREAS, the Village shares jurisdiction of 13 Mile Road from 1,266 feet east of Southfield Road to Greenfield Road with the City; and

WHEREAS, the City has secured federal Highway Safety Improvement Program (“HSIP”) funding for two signal upgrades along 13 Mile Road at Canterbury Street and at Pierce Street; and

WHEREAS, the Village shares jurisdiction of the signal at 13 Mile Road and Pierce Street with the City; and

WHEREAS, the project proposes milling and resurfacing of 13 Mile Road, repairs to underlying concrete, adding a right turn lane for northbound Fairfax Ave traffic, and upgrading sidewalks for compliance with ADA standards, and miscellaneous related work (hereafter referred to as “the Project”) as follows:

13 Mile Road from Southfield Road to Greenfield Road – Mill and resurface the three inch surface of 13 Mile Road between Southfield Road to Greenfield Road, including the addition of a right turn lane, concrete curb and gutter repairs, curb ramps, sidewalk and driveways, permanent signing, pavement markings and related work.

Signal at 13 Mile Road and Pierce Street – Traffic signal modernization to box span, including steel strain poles, controller and cabinets, detection, ADA

improvements, pedestrian signal improvements, backplates, permanent signing, pavement markings and related work.

WHEREAS, the Village and the City have reached an understanding with regard to the Project and desire to memorialize that understanding in writing.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth herein and in conformity with applicable law, it is hereby agreed as follows:

1. The Parties are authorized to enter into this Agreement pursuant to the Urban Cooperation Act, Public Act 7 of 1967, being MCL §124.501 *et seq.*
2. The City will serve as the Requesting Party in the MDOT contract for the Project, and will undertake and complete the Project, as above described, including all related engineering, inspection and administrative services.
3. The actual cost of the Project shall include total payments to MDOT which may include contingency amount (not to exceed 10% of the total payment to MDOT); design engineering, construction engineering, testing, contract administration and inspection costs (estimated at 15% of total payments to the contractor).
4. The estimated \$1,265,661.00 total local share for the cost of the Project shall be allocated between the Parties as follows:

Road Work & Pavement Markings	62%	38%
Pierce Signal Upgrades	50%	50%
Canterbury & Greenfield Signal Upgrades	100%	0%

5. During construction of the Project, the City shall submit monthly invoices to the Village for its share of the Project cost. Upon receiving MDOT's final accounting of the Project, the City will determine the actual total local share of the Project cost and will submit a final invoice to the Village for unpaid balance of the Village's share of the actual Project cost.

6. Any proposed cost increase of 10% or more, over the estimated Project cost, must be approved in writing by the City and the Village. Any overage shall be allocated in accordance with Paragraph 4, above.

7. In accordance with the MDOT Agreement, the selected contractor must provide all appropriate insurance, including an owner's protective policy, and the Village is to be named an additional insured on an endorsement to the contractor's policy under such owner's protective policy. Proof of same shall be provided to the Village upon request.

8. The City, by executing this Contract and undertaking the obligations of the City set forth herein, has not and does not assume jurisdiction of any Village highway or road for purposes of MCL 691.1402. Exclusive jurisdiction of such highways or roads for the purposes of MCL 691.1402 rests with the Village.

Manager Report

Re: June 2, 2026, Manager Report

General Updates

- Mobilization for the **Beverly Park playground** was delayed, but the contract should be onsite before the June 2nd meeting and is also coordinating the shipment and delivery of the playground equipment with the equipment vendor.
- **SmithGroup's [presentation](#) on Wendbrook Park** was reviewed at the May Parks Board meeting and has been posted to the Village's website.
- The contractor for **Safe Routes To School** began completing punch list items last week, including pouring the final remaining section of sidewalk on Beechwood.
- **An application for tree plantings** in Village rights-of-way is being developed.
- Village Administration is preparing to **discuss the Village's millage structure and fund balance levels** as part of the Council's ongoing desire to review the Village's long-term financial and service-level goals.
- The **RFP for the FY 2027 sidewalk replacement program** has been completed and will be posted in the coming days and responses due in June.
- The **RFP for the Beverly Park fence project** has been completed and will be posted in the coming days and responses are due in June.
- The **traffic calming device** for Beverly road will be installed before the next Village Council meeting.
- **Public Works** current projects include:
 - New baskets for disc golf at Beverly Park have been installed.
 - Prepping for culvert replacement at Stellamar street is ongoing.
 - Landscaping was installed at the new public safety building sign.

- **New signage** at the Public Safety Building has been installed.
- **BS&A Cloud** is set to **go live in July**. The Village's current system will be down for three days in the conversion process, and it is anticipated that Village Hall will be closed to the public for two of these days as staff receive training on the new system. More information is forthcoming.
- **Union negotiations** with the **Command Officers** occurred on May 28th to review a proposed a tentative agreement. Review of this agreement is expected to occur at the next Village Council meeting.
- In May the **Zoning Board of Appeals** denied a previously tabled dimensional variance from its March 9th meeting and adopted Bylaws. The ZBA will not meet in June, as no variance applications were submitted before the deadline.
- The **Planning Commission** met on May 27th and approved a sign permit for **Detroit County Day**. Also at the meeting, the Commission heard from Giffels Webster
- The Village would like to extend a thank you to all those who volunteered and sponsored the **Memorial Day Parade!**

PROJECT UPDATES

Transportation Alternatives Program Sidewalks

Last week Toebe Construction (the general contractor) continued to finish the retaining wall on Evergreen Road and continued to perform work along 13 Mile Road. This week Toebe is schedule to perform the following work (weather permitting):

Evergreen

- Continue to form and pour sidewalks along Evergreen Road
- Install topsoil and grass in areas where the sidewalk is completed
- Water areas where restoration and trees has been placed.
- Install HMA along Evergreen Road and on driveways

13 Mile

- Continue retaining wall installation at 13 Mile and Stafford and possibly start at 13 Mile and Rivers Edge.
- Start to rouge grade for the proposed sidewalk (starting at Evergreen working towards west Village limits).
- Install topsoil and trees after the retaining wall at Stafford is complete.



In order to safely perform the proposed work along Evergreen Road, the contractor will need to perform intermittent daily road closures of Evergreen Road. All driveways will be accessible, however, though traffic will not be permitted. After each working day, Evergreen Road will be opened to traffic until the next morning (or when necessary).

In order to work safely along 13 Mile Road, the Contractor has placed a one lane closure in area where work is being performed. These closures will be removed at the end of each work day. These closures do not include at the intersection of 13 Mile Road and Lahser, which will be closed until the work is completed.

FY25/26 Road Improvement Project

The contractor will be back in the spring to complete minor punch list work and install/touch-up any turf grass areas that have not been established. A structure adjustment needs to be made in the RCOG right-of-way at Birwood and Greenfield. Additionally, the southwest corner of Birwood and Greenfield is being reevaluated as ponding has been occurring.
